CHARACTERS

Do you think the characters were realistically portrayed? Describe the characters' personalities.

Did a specific character remind you of someone you know?

What did you think about Dani and Malone's relationship? How does age affect Dani and Malone's relationship?

Were there any moments where you disagreed with the choices of any of the characters? What would you have done differently?

How does loss shape the personalities of certain characters?

What is motivating the actions of the characters in the story?

What past influences are shaping the actions of the characters in the story?

Do the main characters change by the end of this novel? Do they grow or mature? What events trigger such changes?

What were the dynamics of "power" between the characters? How did that play a factor in their interactions?

Structure, Writing, and General Discussion: What did you think of the overall structure of the novel? Were you engaged immediately? Did you race to the end, or was this a slow-burn story for you? What did you think about the time-line and point of view? How did you feel reading the story? Which emotions conveyed the story? Did the story keep you interested? Would you say this is a plot-driven book or does the story unfold slowly with a focus on character development? Were you surprised by the plot? Or did you find it predictable? How credible did the author make the setting and dialogue? What scene did you find was the most pivotal for the book? How do you think the story would have changed had that scene not taken place? What scene resonated most with you personally in either a positive or negative way? Did certain parts of the novel make you uncomfortable? Were there any scenes that made you laugh? What is the significance of the title? Did you recognize it in the book? Would you have given the book a different title? If yes, what is your title? What surprised you the most about the book?

What is your impression of Dani's apparent gift? Do you believe people can have abilities like she and Malone?

What were your thoughts as Dani discovered her parents?

Chapter 1:

What were you able to gather about Malone in this chapter? Who is Irene?

Why do you think he's reluctant to go to Cleveland?

Chapter 2:

Did you catch any potential foreshadowing in this chapter?

What are the chances of Dani and Malone being brought together again on the fifteenth anniversary of their first meeting? What were your thoughts as he recognized Dani?

Chapter 3:

Do you agree with Malone's assessment of time: "The jump from ten to twenty-five was a lifetime. The leap from twenty-five to forty was but a long weekend"? Why or why not?

How do you think Dani's gift came about? What purpose does it serve her life? Why does it scare people? Would you be scared?

Chapter 4:

Why do you think Michael is upset when Dani knows about Irene's funeral?

What might the reason be for the apparent cover up of Dani's parents' cause of death?

Chapter 5:

Despite their lack of interaction, Dani finds herself drawn to Malone's belongings. Why do you think this is?

Why do you think Malone asked Ness's opinion on a person having a sixth sense?

Chapter 6:

Considering the details of the Butcher's murders, do you think there is a reason or pattern for the killing? Do you see anything Malone might have missed?

Do you think it could be dangerous for Malone to possibly put Dani into contact with her uncle again, considering his connections?

Discuss the kiss.

Chapter 13:

Why do you think Malone is still guarded when it comes to Dani? Is his excuse of it "being too soon" legitimate?

Do you consider Dani's actions snooping? Is it warranted or is she being disrespectful?

Chapter 14:

Do you agree with Lenka's advice to Dani to be direct about her feelings with Malone?

Malone says, "I'm not at all convinced anyone really wants to know, it's more exciting that way," in regards to the Butcher. Do you think this is true for most gruesome cases? Why are people excited by disturbing things?

Chapter 15:

Why did Ness subtly change his expression when Malone was mentioning the informant, Pete Kostura, who had been run over?

How much about the case do you think Ness is keeping from Malone?

Chapter 16:

After Dani's descriptions of her tactile gift in this chapter, like being caught in a crowd when she touches the couch, are you able to understand what she's experiencing better? Would you want to be the owner of a power like hers?

Do you have any guesses who the drunk man on the couch may be?

Chapter 17:

What do you think of Zuzanna's confession and tears as she considers Dani leaving with Malone in the future?

How do the simultaneous historical events impact your views of the story?

Chapter 18:

Why did Dani have such a visceral reaction to the curtains?

How did that dark moment allow intimacy to grow between Dani and Malone?

Chapter 19:

Why is Malone good at putting distance between himself and Dani? Do you think it's necessary?

What important details did you gather from Dani's inspection of the clothing?

Chapter 20:

Dani says, "The very best things are old, and we let nothing grow old here." Do you agree with this sentiment? Do you prefer old things or the new and fresh?

Michale says, "Equity is impossible. There is inequity in all things." What do you think about his point-of-view?
